Despite family disapproval and industry knockbacks, Wild Wild Women are three singles in and have performed in Mumbai, New Delhi, Pune and Bengaluru. Impressive!

"Our audiences range from college students to clubs, to an all-age Christmas party, and they are not solely women," says Wild Wild Women member Pratika Prabhune. MAJOR WINFOR TRANS RIGHTS.





In Finland, current legislation means an individual must provide proof of infertility before they can be granted legal gender recognition. These extremely invasive medical and psychiatric procedures are abhorrent and are in breach of the European Convention on Human Rights.

Thankfully, a new law – which removes the requirement for trans people to be sterilized and obtain a psychiatric diagnosis to obtain legal gender recognition – has been passed. This is a major victory for equality, removing a harmful barrier to those wishing to have their gender recognised legally. Under this new law, gender recognition will be available upon written application after a mandatory 30-day 'period of reflection'. A much more humane way to go about it!

Despite this good news, the new act only introduces a legal recognition system for adults, so there's still improvements to be made to advance the rights of children too.






